07. INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

7.1 Macro-Thematic Approach

West Morgan's investment philosophy is anchored in identifying long-duration structural themes — technological paradigm shifts, demographic transitions, energy transformations, and geopolitical capital flows — and building concentrated, conviction-driven positions well ahead of mainstream institutional adoption. This approach has enabled the firm to participate in the extraordinary value creation of the internet era, the cryptocurrency infrastructure buildout, and the artificial intelligence revolution.

7.2 Capital Preservation First
